

Community Learning and Skills Promotes British values

Section 26 of the Counter - Terrorism and Security

Act 2015 places a duty on certain bodies, to prevent people from being drawn into terrorism ensuring awareness of risks of terrorism.

The Counter Terrorism and Security Act 2015 has introduced the prevent duty which came into force 1st July 2015.

Extremism - “vocal or active opposition to fundamental British values, including democracy, the rule of law, individual liberty and mutual respect and tolerance of different faiths and beliefs”.

What are British Values?

These are shared universal values that are adopted by Britain.

British values are defined as “democracy, the rule of law, individual liberty and mutual respect and tolerance for those with different faiths and beliefs”; institutions are expected to encourage students to respect other people with particular regard to the protected characteristics set out in the Equality Act 2010.

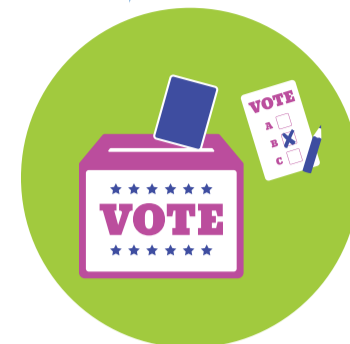
ALL staff have a legal responsibility under the Prevent Duty to make sure that:

- They have undertaken training in the Prevent Duty as identified by their leaders and managers
- They are aware of when it is appropriate to refer concerns about students, learners or colleagues to the Prevent officer, usually the provider’s safeguarding officer
- They exemplify British values of “democracy, the rule of law, individual liberty and mutual respect and tolerance for those with different faiths and beliefs” into their practice
